




# A Community of Thought

  - ILP is open to all interested applicants, regardless of school, major, or prior participation in BFS/ISP.

# Expectations of ILPers

- ILPers are expected to participate in ILP events in order to foster discussion, explore the subject matter, and build a community.
- Events are intended for >20 people, and are often discussion-based.
  - The more people that attend, the more successful the event due to the increased diversity of backgrounds and viewpoints.
- Applicants should be open to intellectual risk-taking in a supportive, multidisciplinary community setting, and have a history of engagement in their College House or in a similar program.

# Applying to ILP

Pro Edition

- Be creative in your essay.
  - Prior essays have included philosophical ruminations, poetry, and jokes(There's no fixed format).
- What's the proof?
  - It's important that you demonstrate that you were active in your College House, in a similar community, or similar relevant academic experience.
  - ILP is only as good as the people, and it's important that all applicants are committed to exploring different ideas in a community setting.
- Proofread, proofread, proofread your work.
  - An essay written in 10 minutes will probably not be successful.
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# Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I need to have done ISP to apply?

A: No, the program is open to **all** interested applicants. Non-BFS along with BFS are encouraged to apply/

Q: Do I have a guarantee to get in if I am in ISP?

A: All submitted applications will be reviewed. While it is true that a large portion of current ILPers finished ISP, the goal is to have the program as representative of the general Penn community as possible.

Q: Can I answer all of the questions in haiku form?

A: Raps or music videos are preferred.
